The European Union was founded on the basis of promises of peace, freedom, prosperity and strategic autonomy. What does it stand for today? War, censorship, authoritarianism, economic stagnation, if not outright deindustrialisation, and geopolitical subjugation to Washington's dictates. The British-Italian journalist Thomas Fazi argues that the entire process of European integration, even in its pre-EU forms, should be understood first and foremost not as an economic but as a political project: a project aimed at disempowering mass democracy, which the elites had been trying to contain since the Second World War. This process reached a turning point with the signing of the Maastricht Treaty, which effectively embedded neoliberalism within the fabric of the European Union. In this way, the member states were transformed into something akin to colonies of Brussels and Frankfurt.

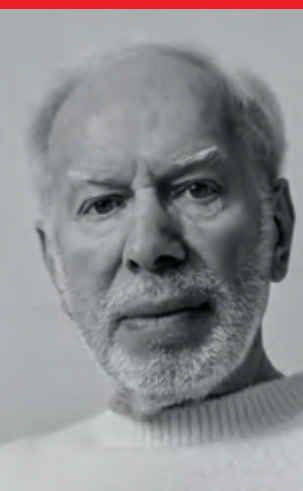

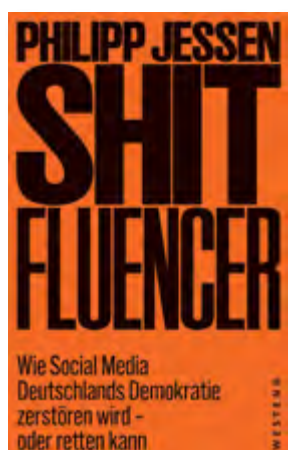

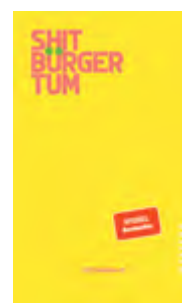
